SUMMER GROUP EXHIBITION : "STARTING WITH LANDSCAPE"

Lieberman & Saul Gallery is pleased to announce a SUMMER GROUP EXHIBITION entitled STARTING WITH LANDSCAPE. The exhibition will open on Wednesday, May 30, and run through Friday, August 3. Summer hours are indicated above.

Works by each of the fifteen artists included in the show have some relationship to the theme of landscape, or a strong telluric reference, but each treats the subject in a highly distinctive way.

The show includes recent work by GEORGE WOODMAN, SANDRA HABER, and SALLY APFELBAUM, who will each be exhibiting for the first time at this gallery. WOODMAN combines images from disparate sources, in this case all gardens, while APFELBAUM, in her recent Giverny series, creates layered exposures by pointing the camera in four directions. HABER uses all found and appropriated images, merging geometric shapes with references to well-known paintings, here Millet's Reaper.

Recent diptychs by gallery artists JOHN SCHLESINGER, who shoots images directly from the movie screen, and STEPHEN FRAILEY, who also appropriates images, represent diametrically opposed emotional levels, the former being highly charged. SUSIE KUNZ shoots landscape images from books which she then manipulates in amusing and perplexing ways.

New large scale prints by GERALD INCANDELA depict the Japanese landscape, and also very lyrical are the pin-hole prints by SOKHI WAGNER and the romantic square format landscapes of SALLY GALL.

Finally, MITCHELL SYROP and GEANNA MEROLA, both gallery artists, use collage- the former uses kitsch landscape posters that are torn to form combinations of image and text, and MEROLA uses photographs as the starting point to combine multiple images and employ a variety of painterly and graphic media.
